



An evening of Mele & Hula at Lanikuhonua

What better way to spend a mellow Sunday evening than enjoying Mele & Hula at Lanikuhonua. This celebration of Hawaiian song and dance is scheduled for August 14, from 4:15 p.m. to 9 p.m., at the Campbell Company's spectacular oceanfront estate at Ko Olina, and is sponsored by the James & Abigail Campbell Family Foundation, the James Campbell Company and Lanikuhonua Cultural Institute.

"One of the Foundation's priorities is to perpetuate and encourage the practice of Hawaiian culture, and this concert is just one more way to share it by bringing the community together to celebrate the beauty of our mele and hula," said Kapi'olani Marignoli, president of the Foundation.

The concert will be headlined by Grammy-nominated Amy Hānaiali'i, and will also showcase

the keiki of Aha Pūnana Leo O Wai'anae, singer and songwriter Weldon Kekauoha, the Westside group Na Palapalai, Kumu Hula O'Brian Eselu's Halau Ke Kai O Kahiki, Kumu Hula Twyla Mendez's Halau Na Pua A Lei, and Tony Silva of Da Braddahs.

This is the third Hawaiian cultural event initiated and sponsored by the Foundation — the other two events are the Lei O Lanikuhonua Hula Festival and the Lauhoe O Lanikuhonua Canoe Festival, which are for high school students.

Food and beverages will be available for purchase from Pat's Piggery, Poke Stop, Kapolei High School Hurricane Heat Culinary Arts Program, Waiialua Soda, Hawaiian Springs, and Erin's Shave Ice. Tickets for the event are \$30 and can be purchased at the concierge desk at the JW Marriott Ihilani Resort and Spa,

Lanikuhonua, whose literal translation means "where heaven meets the earth," was once a place of retreat and leisure for Hawai'i's chiefs. The property has been in the Campbell family since 1877 and has continued to preserve, display and promote the cultural customs of ancient Hawai'i. For more than 30 years, the Foundation has been committed to perpetuating the Hawaiian culture and supporting programs that form stronger families, provide more effective educational programs, and improve the quality of life for the people of Hawai'i.
